JUVENILE JUSTICE POLICY ADVOCATE

Position:

The National Center for Youth Law (NCYL) seeks a policy advocate for its Juvenile Justice Reform Project. The Project seeks to reduce over reliance on incarceration and to expand non-custodial supports for youth in trouble with the law. The applicant must have a strong commitment to juvenile justice reform and a graduate degree in public policy or another relevant field which includes training in quantitative analysis. Significant relevant experience can be substituted for the graduate degree. Excellent writing and analytic skills, and a willingness to travel are required. An ability to collaborate effectively with a wide array of juvenile justice systems stakeholders and advocates is also essential. Substantive knowledge of juvenile justice issues preferred.
